- Has maintained at least a 2.5 GPA

The scholarships are presented to high school seniors residing in Lexington County who will be attending a South Carolina college, university, or technical college. The applicants must be planning a major in an agricultural or environmental related field such as: vocational agriculture education, agriculture economics or engineering, agronomy, natural resources, biology, forestry, horticulture, etc.

The recipients must demonstrate ability, knowledge, and need in the application. The applicants must have met admission requirements and have been accepted to the institutions of their choice.

Sponsors of this scholarship program include: Lexington Soil and Water Conservation District Board of Commissioners, businesses, organizations, and individual citizens who have designated funds for this program.
